Title: Accommodations

Hello. The Maryland courts provide reasonable accommodations for persons with disabilities in accordance with the Americans with Disabilities Act, also known as the ADA. If you need to request an accommodation for a hearing or event in the Maryland Courts, I'm here to help.

Make your request in writing. Use Form Number CC-DC-049. It is called Request for Accommodation for Person with Disability. You may download the form from mdcourts.gov/ada or pick up a copy from any Maryland Court. Be sure to fill out the entire form. Be specific about what you need. You may attach additional information or other documents that support your request. Submit the completed form at the courthouse where your hearing or event is scheduled. When possible, submit the form at least 30 days before your hearing. Then, the ADA Coordinator will contact you to make arrangements for an appropriate accommodation. If we are unable to provide the specific accommodation you request, we will contact you to discuss options.

If you have a question about this process or wish to request an accommodation for an unscheduled visit, call the courthouse and ask to speak to the ADA coordinator. You can find more information at mdcourts.gov/ADA. I hope this has been helpful. Thanks for watching.
