The following questions for the above referenced RFP were received by e-mail and are answered and posted for all prospective Offerors who received the RFP. The statements and interpretations contained in the following responses to questions are not binding on the Maryland Judiciary unless the RFP is expressly amended. Nothing in the Maryland Judiciary's response to these questions is to be construed as agreement to or acceptance by the Maryland Judiciary of any statement or interpretation on the part of the offeror asking the question.

1. Question: Is there a minimum number of students per class?

Response: The District Court of Maryland has not established a minimum number of students per class requirement. The minimum and maximum number of students per class and per instructor as determined by the Offeror, should be included in the Offeror's technical proposal.

2. Question: Have you requested CPR/AED Training in the past? If so, what was the amount of the winning bid?

Response: Chesapeake Region Safety Council has conducted CPR/AED Training for the District Court of Maryland in the past for less than \$25,000 per year.

3. How much notice will the Offeror receive before a given class (to plan for instructor availability, etc.)? Is there flexibility in scheduling the classes (again, to plan for flexibility between instructors and AOC)?
