Clerkships with Judge Albright

Judge Albright has two one-year ("Term") clerkships available each year, commencing and ending in August. A candidate must have completed law school prior to the commencement of the clerkship. Applications for 2024-2025 Term Law Clerks will be accepted beginning May 15, 2023. Term Law Clerks are full time, at-will, employees. The yearly salary is \$64,884.00. Judge Albright welcomes candidates from all backgrounds.

Term Law Clerks join a chambers team that consists of Judge Albright, a Senior Law Clerk, and two Term Law Clerks. All are expected to research and draft opinions, review opinions drafted by others, proofread, assist Judge Albright in preparing for oral argument, and attend oral argument. All are expected to work independently and in collaboration. All are expected to work at Judge Albright's chambers in Rockville, Maryland, with travel to Annapolis, Maryland approximately once per month. Occasional telework will be considered. Successful candidates will be disciplined writers with excellent law school grades and well-developed legal research skills. Accordingly, preference will be given to candidates with law review or law journal experience, or prior clerkship experience.

Candidates should forward (in PDF format) a cover letter, resume, law school transcript (official or unofficial), three references, and two writing samples to Robert McCabe, Esquire at robert.mccabe@mdcourts.gov. Candidates will be selected for at least one interview, which may be conducted in person or remotely.
