CLERKSHIPS

Justice Gould employs two law clerks, who typically serve a one-year term beginning in late August/early September. The applications for the 2026-2027 term are now closed. Applicants for the 2027-2028 term should begin submitting applications in January 2026. Applicants should submit a cover letter, resume, law school transcript, undergraduate transcript, two writing samples (reflecting the applicant's original work), a list of at least three references, and at least one letter of reference. INTERNSHIPS

Justice Gould accepts applications from law students for unpaid judicial internships for the fall, spring, and summer semesters. Applications are reviewed on a rolling basis. Justice Gould is not currently accepting applicants for internships. Applicants for the Spring 2026 term should submit applications in the fall. Fall and spring internships are part-time; summer internships are full-time. For the most part, all work will be in person. Internship applicants should submit a cover letter, resume, law school transcript, undergraduate transcript, 1-2 writing samples (reflecting the applicant's original work), and a list of references or letters of recommendation.
