Clerkships with Judge Berger Appellate Court of Maryland

Judge Berger employs a term clerk each year. The term clerk typically serves for one year, beginning in late August. A candidate is required to successfully complete law school prior to the beginning of their clerkship. The primary responsibilities of the term law clerk are research and writing. Therefore, preference is given to those candidates with law review or journal experience. Judge Berger's team consists of a chambers counsel, a term law clerk, and a judicial assistant. The hiring process includes an in-person interview with the judge, chambers counsel, judicial assistant, and current term law clerk. Applicants should be prepared to submit a second writing sample shortly after the in-person interview.

Applications will be accepted for the 2027-28 term beginning in January 2026, and the judge hires on a rolling basis. Applicants should submit a cover letter, résumé, law school transcript, and a writing sample. Applicants should also list at least three references or provide at least three letters of recommendation.
