CLERKSHIPS

Justice Booth employs two law clerks, who typically serve a one-year term beginning in mid-August. Justice Booth reviews applications from law school graduates and law students who have received at least three semesters of grades. Justice Booth welcomes applicants with diverse backgrounds, work experience prior to or after law school, and an interest in public service work.

Justice Booth is not currently accepting term law clerk applications as she has completed hiring for the 2025–2026 term.

INTERNSHIPS

Justice Booth accepts applications from law students for unpaid judicial internships for the fall and spring semesters. Applications are reviewed on a rolling basis.

Internship applicants should submit a cover letter, resume, official or unofficial law school transcript, a list of references, and one writing sample. Please note in the cover letter whether you are pursuing the internship for academic credit and any requirements for you to receive credit.
