ORDER

The Court having passed an Order on April 5, 2018 prohibiting from the further practice of law in the State of Maryland certain attorneys who were in default in the payment of annual assessments, providing their social security numbers, and/or providing their federal tax identification information to the Client Protection Fund of the Bar of Maryland, and

It appearing that the Client Protection Fund of the Bar of Maryland certified to the Court the name of ARETHA JONES ARRINGTON as an attorney who was purportedly in default in payment of annual assessments and providing information regarding her federal tax identification information, and documentation in the form of an obituary having been received by the Fund subsequent to the certification of default indicating that Mrs. Arrington passed away on December 22, 2017, it is therefore, this 17th day of April, 2018

ORDERED, by the Court of Appeals of Maryland, that the above mentioned Order of April 5, 2018 be, and it is hereby, rescinded as to the attorney listed above, and it is further

ORDERED that the Clerk of this Court shall forward a copy of this Order to the clerks of the Court of Special Appeals, the several circuit courts of the counties and Baltimore City and the Chief Clerk of the District Court.
