This Court's March 5, 2025 Order *Nisi* was entered and posted on the Judiciary's website pursuant to Rule 19-216(f)(2). That Order identified individuals who the State Board of Law Examiners recommended for admission to the Bar of Maryland, subject to each applicant's satisfaction of identified conditions. The Order further provided that it would be ratified as to each identified applicant, effective on April 4, 2025 unless the Court received an exception as to that applicant by that date. No exceptions to the State Board's recommendation have been filed as to any applicant.

Accordingly, it is this 4th day of April 2025, by the Supreme Court of Maryland,

ORDERED that the recommendations for admission of the out-of-state applicants (Rule 19-216) to the Bar of Maryland contained in the State Board's report, filed in this Court on March 5, 2025, are ratified as of April 4, 2025; and it is further

ORDERED that the applicants recommended in the State Board's report for whom the State Board has completed the action required by Rule 19-216(e) and who have satisfied the requirements of Rule 19-212 (Maryland Law Component) and 19-213 (Qualifying MPRE Score Required), will be admitted to practice law in this Court upon taking the oath prescribed by the statute.
