ORDER NISI

The State Board of Law Examiners (the “Board”), after careful consideration of Natalie Tverdynin’s qualifications, has, pursuant to Rule 19-211(a)(1), recommended that she be admitted to the Maryland Bar, conditioned upon her satisfaction of the requirements of Maryland Rules 19-204 (Character Review), 19-212 (Maryland Law Component), and 19-213 (Qualifying MPRE Score).

Based on the Board’s report and recommendation, it is this 27th day of October 2025, by the Supreme Court of Maryland,

ORDERED that, subject to the conditions stated above, the Board’s recommendation to admit Natalie Tverdynin will be ratified on November 26, 2025, unless exceptions to the Board’s recommendation to admit her are filed with the Court before that date; and it is further

ORDERED that, pursuant to Rule 19-211(a)(2), a copy of this Order shall be posted on the Judiciary website within five days of the date of this Order and shall remain posted on the website until the Board’s recommendation is ratified.
