By Order of Court of Appeals the District Court Shall Return on an interim basis to Phase III of Emergency Operations¹

<u>The District Court for Howard County and the District Court for Carroll County Courthouses are open to</u> the public, with limited exceptions.

ANY PERSON who seeks entrance shall be:

(1) subject to COVID-19 screening questions,

(2) subject to non-contact temperature checks where available,

(3) required to wear face masks or coverings, at all times unless directed otherwise and

(4) required to maintain social distancing.

<u>The Phase III Emergency Operations will begin on December 29, 2021 through February 8, 2022.</u> The Following Matters will be conducted:

CRIMINAL & TRAFFIC:

(1) bail reviews and bail reconsiderations, bench warrants including matters involving locally incarcerated defendants.

(2) trials for incarcerated individuals.

(3) trials for other criminal actions alleging violent acts.

(4) trials for alcohol-related motor vehicle cases.

(5) guilty pleas (deferral of any incarceration start date considered).

(6) hearings on petitions for mental health evaluations and competency to stand trial.

(7) preliminary hearings.

(8) Violations of Probation.

(9) Juvenile Waiver Hearings.

(10) any other matters that the Court determines can be handled remotely or without testimony or both.

CIVIL:

(1) emergency evaluation petitions.

(2) quarantine and isolation violation petitions.

(3) body attachments.

(4) temporary and final domestic violence, peace, and extreme risk protective orders and petitions.

(5) temporary restraining orders.

(6) any other matters that can be handled remotely or without testimony or both.

LANDLORD/TENANT:

(1) rent escrow actions, provided local inspection practices are capable of being Conducted.

(2) tenant holding over actions and any associated warrants of restitution.

(3) any breach of lease actions and any associated warrants of restitution.

(4) any wrongful detainer actions and any associated warrants of restitution.

(5) processing of warrants of restitution for failure to pay rent actions.

RECOVERY COURT:

Howard County Recovery Court is fully operational.

ALL OTHER PROCEEDINGS ARE CONTINUED, including:

- 1) Civil Trials
- 2) Failure to pay Rent Cases
- 3) Minor Traffic (unless a request for a remote hearing is filed, or the matter is on the Traffic Waiver docket).
- 4) Parking Citations
- 5) Red-light Camera Citations
- 6) Speed Camera Citations
- 7) School Bus Citations
